
Communication about Student Learning

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District Goals

By 2023, Clayton County Public Schools will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Proficient and/or Distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestones to at least 80% in each content area.

Northcutt School Goals

At Home

- Incorporate Math while shopping

- Play math games online
- Use sight words
- Complete i-Ready assignments
